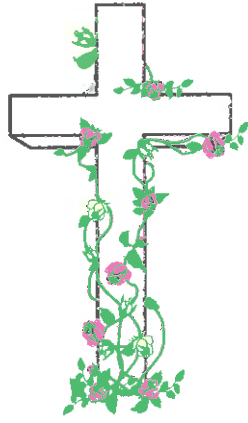

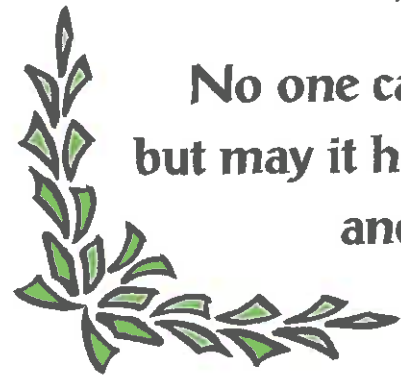

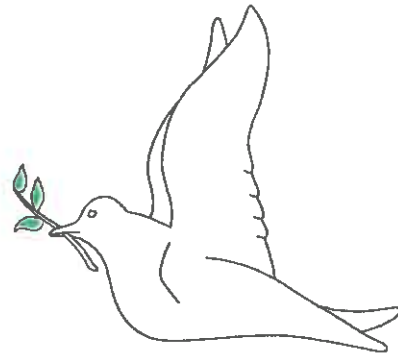

A Trip To London

A party from Wren Hall were to go to London for a 2009 Care awards ceremony. Lucy Smith, one of our senior nurses and myself had been so graciously nominated for an award by Anita.

The day began badly for me. Lucy had organised a mini-bus to pick me up at 8am. For me this is an unearthly hour to be scrubbed, polished, fed and ready to go. With suitcase packed I eventually retired to bed around mid-night, having made sure the alarm clock was set. During the night I woke up and stretching out my arm to switch on the bedside light to check the time, I sent the alarm clock flying off the table and crashing into the wardrobe. The time was 1.50am. The glass had come off the clock, the two hands were missing and the battery had rolled under the bed. Climbing out of bed I scrambled about on the floor gathering up the said pieces and attempted to put the thing back together and then finding it did not work. Oh S- -t, what was I going to do? Then I remembered a very old teas-made that was donkeys years old and had not been used for at least 12 years. This was dug out, plugged in, tested and found to be in working condition. With order restored it was back to bed. When the mini-bus arrived I was all ready to go. Arriving at the station in Nottingham, we quickly discovered our train was due to arrive at platform I. It definitely stated this on the destination board. Finding the lifts out of order, we trudged down the steps, lugging our suitcases onto platform 1. A train was already waiting at the platform, so we all decided that this was our train. Led by our indomitable leader, Sharon, we all piled on only to discover to our horror

that we were on the wrong train and it was due to leave in less than five minutes. There was a mad scramble to get off, and as we stood there waiting patiently on the platform we appeared to be the only people waiting for the London train. I thought this was strange and casually mentioned it to our party, they agreed so someone went off to investigate and came back with the news that we should be on platform 4. Trudging back up the steps and down to platform 4, we stood around for a little time, then the tannoy announced that due to some technical problem the London train would be arriving at platform 1. Back up the steps again and down to platform 1. By this time I was almost gasping for breath. Very soon the train arrived and we all boarded and settled down to what we thought would be a nice pleasant journey to the capital. This was not to be, the heating system had broken down, and by the time we reached our destination we were half frozen. The day had started badly for me and was now getting worse. Surely things must soon get better, and they certainly did.

We were booked into one of London's top hotels and after checking in we settled down to a nice cup of tea. At this point, my son arrived to join us, he lives in London but had been kindly invited by Anita to spend the night with us at the hotel. After relaxing and finally getting warm, it was time to get moving as we had booked to see 'The Lion King' at the Lyceum theatre, a Disney musical that we all thoroughly enjoyed. The singing and stage effects were really outstanding. This production finished about 4.45pm and our program for the awards ceremony stated, champagne reception at 6.30. We emerged from the theatre into a dark, wet and cold miserable night, and in my opinion with not

too much time to find a taxi and get back to the hotel. We finally managed this with less than an hour to get showered and changed into our finery. This might seem ample time to some people, but I was built for comfort not speed.

The event was a gala evening, and after the reception the call came for dinner where we all sat down to a nice meal washed down with copious amounts of wine and the 'Vernon Sisters' entertained us with some nostalgic singing, after the style of the 'Andrew Sisters.' Then came the awards ceremony. There were five finalists in each category and Ruby Wax was to present the awards. As winners were announced, their respective supporters cheered and shouted and generally raised the roof. I thought noisy buggers, but when Lucy's name was announced as winner of her category, best dementia nurse, we didn't raise the roof, we blew it off completely. I was very proud to be associated with such a bunch of yelling yobo's. We Wren Hall supporters certainly out-shouted everyone else in the room that evening. With a final photo-shoot on stage of the winners and runners up, we all moved on to the disco where shoes were flung off, ties removed and corsets slackened. The noise was deafening, and after a few wild gyrations round the room I bade them all goodnight and slunk off to my room around 1.15 a.m. I believe that some of the group were to be found eating sandwiches in the bar around 3:00a.m. I had been allocated a double bedroom on the 21st floor and had been given two swipe cards to open the door. These were credit card sized and you had to pass them through a slot on the lock mechanism on the door, quite a simple task. There I stood at around 1.30 in the morning, not a soul in sight, passing

a card through the lock. Nothing happened, so I tried swiping it first slow then a bit quicker then faster still. Still the door refused to open. I then tried the other card with the same result, by this time mild panic was setting in, so with one last effort I swiped the card as fast as I could accompanied by my favourite expletive, and the door opened, I was in. Into bed and slept like a log.

Down to breakfast next morning with my son, we looked round for the rest of our party, they were nowhere to be seen, so we sat and had a leisurely breakfast. By the time we had finished none of our party had put in an appearance, then we discovered that there was another breakfast room on the 3rd floor. Up we went and found some of the group having breakfast with the others probably still in bed. Not knowing our groups plans for the day, and not wanting to tramp around London sight-seeing, I decided to go off for the day with my son, arranging to meet the others at St Pancras station at around 6.30.pm, our train was due to leave at 7.00.pm. Finally boarding the train we were involved in another shambles, passengers who had booked the train to Newark were told to transfer to the Nottingham line, as there had been an incident on their route. This caused a bit of chaos, with people sitting in our booked seats. A stern look from Anita and the words, you are sitting in our seats, soon rectified the situation.

Finally home after a 2 hour 50 minute journey. By the way you may be wondering how I fared in the awards, I was a runner up in my category, which for me was a great honour for just doing something that give me so much pleasure.

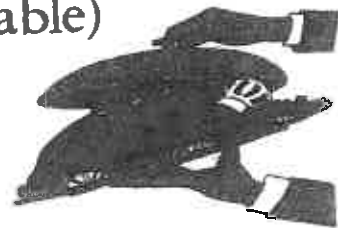

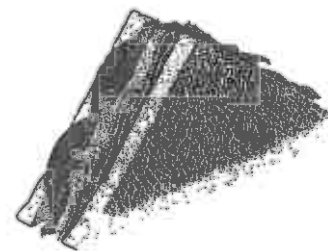
